

# Road Resurfacing Works

## Port Wakefield Road, Main North Road and Grand Junction Road Intersection night works

We will be undertaking road resurfacing works at the intersection of Port Wakefield Road, Main North Road and Grand Junction Road. These works will improve the safety and amenity of the road for all users.

### What's happening:

We are installing new kerbs and medians and resurfacing the asphalt at the intersection of Port Wakefield, Main North Road and Grand Junction Road. This project is necessary to ensure the road remains in good condition as wear and tear can cause potholes and uneven surfaces over time.

### How this affects you:

There will be changes to traffic conditions at different times to keep everyone safe. Please follow traffic management directions while works are in progress. Speed and lane restrictions will be required while works are underway.

Pedestrians and cyclists might also need to use a different path during the works. Signs will be in place to show you where to go.

Minor noise and dust disturbances can be expected while works are being undertaken, but we will minimise any disturbance to residents as much as practically possible. You might also notice some odours, which is normal during asphalt work.

Outside of working hours, all lanes will open to traffic in each direction with some speed restrictions in place.
