

# Ngarkat Highway – Pinnaroo to Bordertown

## Audio Tactile Line Marking Works

We are installing Audio Tactile Line Marking (ATLM) on the Ngarkat Highway, from Pinnaroo to Bordertown, to improve safety for road users by reducing cross carriageway crashes.

### What's happening:

ATLM installation will be undertaken on the Ngarkat Highway, between Pinnaroo and Bordertown. ATLM is used to reduce 'run-off-road' or cross carriageway crashes by creating a noise (audio) and vibratory (tactile) warning to road users who have strayed from the road lane.

### How this affects you:

To undertake this work safely, there will be speed and lane restrictions in place during working hours. Works will move progressively south from Pinnaroo towards Bordertown. Please plan your trips, be cautious around workers, and follow temporary speed limits and signage.

**The Ngarkat Highway will remain open at all times** and access to properties will be maintained.

**There will be no works between Tuesday, 19 December 2023 and Saturday, 6 January 2024.**
