

Princes Highway Corridor Upgrade

Mount Gambier pavement works

We are upgrading the Princes Highway Corridor, from Meningie to the South Australian/Victorian border, to improve long term safety and efficiency for all road users. The \$190 million Princes Highway Corridor program is jointly funded by the Australian (80%) and South Australian (20%) governments.

What's happening

We are undertaking pavement works to improve road surface quality. Works involve removing the existing pavement and replacing it with new asphalt.

How this affects you

To do this work safely, we'll have speed and lane restrictions in work areas. Please plan your trips, be cautious around workers, and follow the speed limits and signs.

You will still be able to access businesses and homes. If we need to limit access, we'll let property owners know ahead of time.

Pedestrians and cyclists, please be cautious when passing through work zones. Some areas might have limited access for safety reasons. We'll put up signs to guide you to other routes if needed.

During the works, there might be some noisy disruptions from time to time, but we'll do our best to keep the noise to a minimum. You might also notice some odours, which is normal during asphalt work.

No works will be undertaken between Friday, 22 December 2023 and Sunday, 7 January 2024.
